FWS FY24 Tribal Wildlife

- The Department of Interior recently published internal guidance in December 2023, for bureaus to consider Indigenous Knowledge in their decision making.
 - One of the Department Manual's main points of emphasis for considering IK in decision making is to ensure Tribal sovereignty is upheld in every process.
 - Connected to this is to engage Tribes on how they determine how the information is used and protected.

- As the Department has demonstrated robust Tribal engagement, the USFWS has followed with establishing Co-Stewardship Teams in 6 areas, 1) Education and Training, 2) Community of Practice, 3) Indigenous Knowledge, 4) Refuges, 5) Pacific Hawaiian Community, and 6) Communication.
 - These sub-teams are in alignment with the FWS 2022 Director's Order 227, but their foundation is in the FWS Native American Policy.
 - USFWS HQ is working directly with the Department on step-down guidance on how the Service will consider Indigenous Knowledges into our decision making.
 - The most recent Service project that Science in the Service fellow Aiden

Valverde undertook will assist in identifying some of the challenges for the process.

- Finally, we want to make sure Tribes are aware of the FWS Tribal Wildlife Grant opportunity.
 - The Tribal Wildlife Grant program was established in 2003 and provides support to Native American Tribes for their wildlife conservation efforts.
 - The TWG recognizes Tribal sovereignty and has an aim to assist Tribes in the management and conservation of their natural resources.
 - The maximum award per Tribe is \$200,000.
 - The closing date of the funding opportunity is June 21, 2024.
 - If needed, CFWO can assist in technical assistance for review of your proposal.
