We understand you represent the responsible parties, the owners and operators of the M/V Selendang Ayu, and their guarantors regarding the M/V Selendang Ayu incident. Attached is a table summarizing Natural Resource Damage Assessment pre-assessment work currently proposed by the State of Alaska and Federal Natural Resource Trustees for the incident. The total estimated cost of this work is \$1,956,188.

Because of the need to proceed promptly with pre-assessment activities, it is necessary that you advise Gina Belt and Alex Swiderski in writing (by fax to Gina at 907-271-5827 and Alex at 907-278-7022) by 12:00 p.m. Alaska time on Monday, December 20, 2004, whether your clients agree to fund the work described in the table. If no response is received or if your clients decline to fund the work, this request will be submitted to the National Pollution Funds Center for funding from the Oil Spill Liability Trust Fund, as outlined in Section 1012 of the Oil Pollution Act of 1990.

The following table summarizes the estimated costs of Natural Resource Damage Assessment pre-assessment activities proposed by the U.S. Department of the Interior, U.S. Department of Commerce, and State of Alaska for the M/V Selendang Ayu incident. The time period for the performance of this work is from December, 8, 2004, through February 28, 2005. The estimated costs for these activities are based on currently available information. As the incident unfolds, modifications to the estimated costs may be necessary. In light of the characteristics of this incident and the type of fuel involved, the trustees may identify further pre-assessment needs in the coming months. We will inform you of additional pre-assessment activities as the need for them arises, in the event you agree to fund the activities identified in the following table. Logistics and travel costs reflect the remote location, weather conditions, and lack of infrastructure in the vicinity of the spill.
