Subject: 2024 District Hay Units

Big Stone Wetland Management District will be allowing hay cutting on Arends, Gislason Lake, and Peterson Waterfowl Production Areas (WPAs) this year.

Hay units are as follows:

Arends WPA (124 acres) is a mix of cool and native warm season grasses and forbs. The hay unit is on the south side of the WPA and can be accessed via a locked gate in the southwest corner. The north boundary is defined by ownership and land use corner points.

Gislason Lake WPA (18 acres) is dominated by smooth brome grass interspersed with sweet clover. Access is via an approach on the southeast corner of the unit. The bulk of the unit is defined by wetlands and a creek on the north, northwest, and southwest of the unit. Hay may be cut along the eastern fence heading north from the approach to access the main unit.

Peterson WPA (93 acres) is a mix of cool and native warm season grasses and forbs with a strong component of sweet clover. The hay unit is on the south side of the unit and bounded by wetland on the north and east sides. Access is via an approach along State Hwy 91 on the west side of the unit.

Haying on all units is being conducted in an effort to knock down dense stands of sweet clover, slow the spread of trees, and to add habitat heterogeneity on the landscape.

\*All acreages are approximate and may be less due to terrain or tree stands. Care should be taken to avoid rutting in wet areas – hayers will be held responsible for excessive damage due to unfavorable soil conditions.

Haying can begin on July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024, after a Special Use Permit is issued and signed by both the hayer and the District manager. Bales must be removed by August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and within 7 days after baling. Wetlands can be hayed if they are dry enough to get equipment into the area without rutting the ground. Prior to bidding, a site visit is STRONGLY encouraged. Cooperators are responsible for following all terms and conditions identified in the special use permit.

Permittees will be selected based on receipt of sealed high bid for the hay unit. Sealed bids are due at the District office no later than 12 pm (noon) on July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

### 2024 Haying Permit Special Conditions

### Permit # 32641-24-

- 1. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service reserves the right to modify the timing of haying or terminate the SUP if habitat conditions warrant.
- 2. All equipment for haying, including ATVs and UTVs, must be clean and free of invasive species plant material, including seeds, before entering any Refuge, WPA, or Service easement. The Refuge Manager reserves the right to inspect and deny the use of any equipment/vehicle etc. that appears to contain invasive species plant material or seeds.
- 3. Haying outside the boundary of the successfully bid upon unit is not permitted and subject to penalties and fines.
- 4. One cutting of hay is permitted starting July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- 5. The entire unit must be cut, baled, and removed. This includes all woody vegetation. Vegetation that is cut must be removed from the unit.
- 6. Bales must be removed from the unit within one week (7 days) after baling, but no later than August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- 7. Permittee assumes all liability for damages occurring due to having operations including damage to refuge lands and facilities.
- 8. Any deviations from the special conditions must be approved by the Refuge Manager and designee in advance.
- 9. Payment is due upon receipt of invoice.
- 10. Failure to comply with special conditions may result in the forfeiture of future haying privileges and future consideration for bidding on any Refuge programs.







# Hay Unit: Arends WPA ~124 acres Big Stone Wetland Management District










# Hay Unit: Gislason Lake WPA ~18 acres Big Stone Wetland Management District








