Re. M/V Selendang Ayu - Compensive Reference Beach Study

Dear Sirs:

I am writing to follow up on our meetings of Monday, January 10 and Thursday, January 13, 2005, during which we discussed the performance of a cooperative reference heach study by the U.S. Flak and Wildlife Service (FWS) and the responsible parties (RPs) in connection with the evaluation of scattering montality resulting from the M/V Solendary Ayu incident. I understand that the parties have reached agreement on the following terms of the cooperative reference beach study:

- 1. The parties have prepared three insmally acceptable protocols (Protocols). The Protocols are entitled: (1) Italia Protocol for Domining Levels of Kird Background Mortality. (2) Joint Protocol for Assessment of Bird Caronson Lest to Scavengers and to Rewash, and (3) Joint Protocol for Determining Scarcher Dediction [sic] Efficiency. Copies of the Protocols, which have been signed by Vernon Byrd and Dan Varoujean for the PWS and the RPs, respectively, are smached.
- 2. The RPs will pay all costs associated with performing the reference beach activities. Costs which will be paid directly by the RP include the costs of providing actial and land based platforms for the performance of the work. Costs which shall be reimbursed by the RPs within thirty (30) days of receipt of appropriate cost documentation include travel and transportation costs of FWS personnel from their duty spations to Dutch Harbur, labor costs and per diem.

3. Unless mutually agreed by both parties, data collected pursuant to and in accordance with the Protocols shall not be challenged by either party and shall be the only data used by either party for determining background mortality of scabirds in connection with releases of oil which have occurred to date, i.e., January 24, 2005, from the M/V Salendary Ayu. In the event that there are additional releases, however, the parties understand that it may be necessary or desirable to conduct additional reference beach studies.

If the RPs are in agreement with the terms of the cooperative reference basch study as described above, please sign the acknowledgment line below and return to me (my fax number is 271-4143) by the close of business on Wednesday, January 26, 2005. In addition, while I assume that Dan Varoujean is authorized by the RPs to sign documents, such as the Protocols, on the RPs' behalf in connection with this matter, I would appreciate it if you would confirm that my assumption is in fact correct.
