



PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES

Overnight parking, camping, fires, and littering.

Use of motorized watercraft. Non-motorized vessels can be used to hunt migratory birds.

Baiting (including hunting with the aid of or distribution of any feed, salt, or other mineral).

Use of vehicles, including all-terrain vehicles, off-road utility vehicles, and off-highway vehicles except on public roads and in designated parking areas.

Collection of antlers, artifacts, or fossils.

Shooting at a deer from, across, or within 30 feet of the edge of a road open to public transportation.

Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages.

Target shooting.

Entry onto the Refuge earlier than 2 hours before legal shooting time. Hunters must leave the Refuge no later than 2 hours after legal shooting time.

Unleashed pets, except when being actively used for migratory bird or upland game hunting.

Use of nails, wire, screws, or bolts to climb a tree or attach a stand to a tree.

Permanent stands/blinds. Portable or temporary blinds or treestands can only be set up the day of the hunt, and must be removed at the end of each day.

OTHER INFORMATION

All seasons and bag limits are in accordance with Minnesota DNR rules and regulations.

Deer hunting is open during the archery, general firearm, and muzzleloader seasons in designated portions of the Refuge (*see Glacial Ridge National Wildlife Refuge Hunt Map*).

Migratory bird hunting is allowed in designated portions of the Refuge (*see Hunt Map*) for the following gamebirds <u>only</u>: geese, ducks, coots, snipe, woodcock, mourning doves, and rails.

• Hunting is <u>NOT</u> allowed during the Spring Light Goose Conservation Order

Upland game hunting is allowed in designated portions of the Refuge (see Hunt Map):

- Only hunters who possess a Minnesota DNR prairie chicken permit can hunt prairie chickens <u>or</u> sharp-tailed grouse on the Refuge, and only between September 28th and October 6th.
- Huntable species include: prairie chicken and sharp-tailed grouse (with State permit), wild turkey, ring-necked pheasant, gray (Hungarian) partridge, ruffed grouse, rabbit (cottontail and jack), snowshoe hare, and squirrel (fox and gray)

Non-toxic shot is required for <u>ALL</u> bird hunting (including wild turkey) on Refuge lands.
