We are writing to respond to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) office received your request dated February 2, 2024 and assigned it tracking number DOI-FWS-2024-000317. Please cite this number in any future communications with our office regarding your request.

You requested the following "the project record (a.k.a. "Administrative Record") for the FWS rule: "Endangered and Threatened Wildlife and Plants; Establishment of a Nonessential Experimental Population of the Gray Wolf in Colorado" published on 11/8/23 in the Federal Register (88 FR 77014).

By project record, I mean any and all documents included in or relied upon by the agency in making its final NEP/10j decision. I would like copies of correspondence with the other branches of the USFWS (in particular, the Mexican Wolf Recovery Program) as well as with the states (including but not limited to UT, NM, AZ, WY). I also mean any and all presentations, meeting notes, call records, or any other records that were part of the FWS decision making process for this rule.."
