Reserving a campsite



- Camping on Long Island is free
- Camping reservations are ONLY required for 3 weeks in Sept., the early archery season for elk
- There are 20 total campsites in 5 areas. A maximum of 5 people are allowed per campsite
- Campers reserve a site and get a free permit from the Long Island information kiosk at 3888 US-101, Ilwaco, WA



- Arrive at Cutthroat Creek: 3888 US-101, Ilwaco (north of MP 24). The Long Island Kiosk is in the parking lot across from the boat ramp leading to Long Island
- The Long Island camping reservation board is on the back of the kiosk



- Permits are required for hunters and non-hunters
- Camping is limited to 14 days in a 30 day period for any group or individual starting the day the first person arrives and is actively camping
- Check-in: 2 PM and check-out: 12 PM

Camping Permit and Regulations

Permit Instructions:
Fill out the permit form, take off the top portion, fold it in half and place it in the permit reservation kiosk in the reservation lot. Then go to the reservation board at the campsite and reserve your campsite.

Need To Know:

- Campsites are primitive.
- No pets are allowed, bring your own.
- No alcohol, no smoking, no open flames.
- No dogs are allowed.
- No firearms, no hunting, and other weapons are on the island. Please respect the land.
- No vehicles are allowed on the island. Only the boat ramp and the island are accessible.

Getting To and From the Island:

- Boats are used to access the island. A 20' boat is required to reach and leave the island. Land-based vehicles along the shoreline near the island.
- Plan ahead and be prepared. Check our charts and weather reports.

Camping Areas:

- Lewis Campground
- Sawlog Campground
- Pinnacle Rock Campground
- Smoky Hollow Campground
- Sand Spit Campground

- At the reservation kiosk, take and complete the permit in its entirety
- Tear off the top portion, fold it in half and place it, with the permit number facing up, in the campsite slot you want
- Retain the bottom portion and place on the numbered post at your campsite
