Sierra Nevada bighorn sheep

- Sheep have a sticky pad on half of their hooves, which is similar to the texture of climbing shoes. This helps them move gracefully and quickly across steep terrain.
- 2 Sierra Nevada bighorn sheep live up to 14,000 feet in elevation. They can even endure winter storms at these high elevations!
 - 3 This species broke off from the desert bighorn sheep roughly 400,000 years ago! They moved into the Sierra Nevada and have since adapted to living in an alpine environment.



Habitat:

Alpine environments with steep and rocky slopes

Food:

Forage found in alpine meadows and across their habitat

Threats:

Predation, Disease from domestic sheep & goats, Small populations

Needs for Recovery:

Sustainable populations in multiple herd units
