Tiehm's buckwheat

This species lives across just three square miles of remote desert habitat. From the edge of its habitat you can view the entire range of the species!

2 The buckwheat flowers start off yellow, but once pollinated, their flowers turn a bright red color to signal to busy bees and other insects that they are already pollinated.

Dry, upland slopes around 6,000 feet in elevation

Soil:

Dry, open, relatively barren, light colored rocky clay soils

Land development, OHVs, Climate change

Needs for Recovery:

Habitat protected from disturbances, Protected pollinator corridors
