

# Tiehm's buckwheat

- 1** This species lives across just three square miles of remote desert habitat. From the edge of its habitat you can view the entire range of the species!
- 2** The buckwheat flowers start off yellow, but once pollinated, their flowers turn a bright red color to signal to busy bees and other insects that they are already pollinated.
- 3** Tiehm's buckwheat is one of many beautiful native desert plants in the area, helping support a robust pollinator community!

**Status:**  
Endangered

**Habitat:**  
Dry, upland slopes around 6,000 feet in elevation

**Soil:**  
Dry, open, relatively barren, light colored rocky clay soils

**Threats:**  
Land development, OHVs, Climate change

**Needs for Recovery:**  
Habitat protected from disturbances, Protected pollinator corridors
