The Primary Caretaker must be at least 18 years old and demonstrate sufficient experience handling and caring for eagles. At least 300 hours working with eagles is recommended. Your signature on the application affirms that you are requesting eagle(s) for religious purposes.

All live nonreleasable eagles will first be placed with aviaries as space is available, in accordance with our Trust responsibility (see MBPM-6). To acquire a non-releasable eagle for an aviary, an Acquisition and Transfer Request Form (3-202-12) is completed and submitted with a vet letter to the Migratory Bird Permit Office. An Acquisition and Transfer Request Form is also used to notify us if an eagle dies.
