Introduction

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's National Conservation Training Center leads the nation with training and education for natural resource managers to meet the goal of conserving fish, wildlife, plants, and their habitats for the benefit of the American public.

Located in West Virginia's Shenandoah Valley along the Potomac River, NCTC is a pastoral landscape of rolling forested hills and wind-swept farm fields. The campus "footprint" comprises a little over 100 acres, leaving untouched more than 400 acres of natural habitats, including old fields and meadows, deciduous forests, the Potomac River, and shoreline springs, creeks, ponds, small wetlands, and moss-covered limestone cliffs.

The Shenandoah Valley and the Potomac River form natural bird migration corridors, so many species, including over 30 kinds of warblers, can be seen during spring and fall. Year-round residents likely to be seen in winter include the silent, river-stalking Great Blue Heron; the largest of all common woodpeckers, the pileated; and the quintessential eastern winter bird, the brilliant red northern cardinal.

In summer bird enthusiasts delight as they listen to the ethereal, fluty eeoh-lay calls of the vocal wood thrush. Peer into the green canopy above and catch the fleeting orange and yellowhued flashes of Baltimore orioles flitting amid sycamore branches. Some lucky birders may even witness a ruby-throated hummingbird, the East's only humming bird species and one that regularly breeds at NCTC. Over 50 bird species currently nest on campus, including green herons, red-shouldered hawks, barred owls, indigo buntings, and a faithful pair of American bald eagles!
