Trail Grooming



- Trails are groomed as conditions and staff allow, usually once per week.
- Trails are groomed for classic skiing.
- Over nine miles of trails are groomed.

Ensure a safe and enjoyable trip:

- Ski during daylight hours only.
- Tell friends or family where you will be skiing.
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited on ski trails.
- No dogs allowed.
- No snowshoeing on groomed track. Please snowshoe along the side of the trail.

Skunk Ridge	1.2	2.0	More & Most
Cub Hollow	0.5	0.9	Most Difficult
